

Arkansas Thespian Playworks

Arkansas Thespian Playworks Students will have the opportunity to workshop their work with theatre professionals and will receive a staged reading of their play during the Festival. Workshopped plays will be eligible for submission to the International Thespian Festival Playworks program.

Who is Eligible to Submit a Play? Any current Thespian member still in high school.

What are the Content Requirements? Plays can be about any subject matter

1. Plays must be the original work of one individual (no collaborative works or adaptations of pre-existing material will be considered)
2. A script must be a self-contained play with a clear beginning, middle and end; pieces of a longer work-in-progress nature will not be accepted.
3. Musicals are not allowed at this time.
4. Plays must be appropriate for high school students. (No "R" rated scripts will be considered.)

What are the Length Requirements?

Plays should be approximately 10 minutes long; (approx. 10 pages typed)

What are the Formatting Requirements?

Plays must be formatted according to the instructions at this link:

What are the Submission Procedures?

1. Submit only ONE playscript at a time. (If a student wants to submit multiple plays, they must follow these procedures for each separately.)
2. Submission must be typed in 12 Point Courier New.
3. Scripts will ONLY be accepted in a PDF format. Follow this link and fill out the Google form to submit: <https://forms.gle/99hh8WeW9FtwkV2y8>
 - a. If this form does not work for you or you do not have a Google account, email your script to arplayworks@gmail.com
4. On the cover page of each script, type the following information:
 - a. Title of your play
 - b. Your name and mailing address (you may use your school's address)
 - c. Your email address (may use parent's email address)
 - d. Thespian troupe number and name of your school
 - e. Troupe director and their contact info (email and phone number)
5. Troupe directors will be contacted after the script consideration process is completed.

What is the Deadline? You may start sending submissions starting Monday, August 26. Last day to send a submission will be **Friday, November 8th**. This will allow time for submissions to be carefully considered in time for registration in early December. Troupe Directors will be notified by late-November of selection results.

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What is the Quality Control Form? All submissions must include a completed Quality Control form signed by your Troupe Director that states they have read the play and can attest that it is appropriate, original and in compliance with all requirements.

What happens if your play is selected for Festival? All selected playwrights will participate in a development workshop with an industry professional in which they will have the opportunity to improve and strengthen their play through revisions and in exploring directorial choices. Each play will receive a staged reading open to Festival participants.

How is a play copyright-protected? All work is protected by copyright the moment it is created and the writer retains exclusive control of their material. By submitting the work, the playwright agrees to allow Arkansas Thespians to mount a staged reading and for professionals and Festival participants to critique the play.

Playworks Rubric

Each Question will be Answered by one of the following:

1.	Is the piece free of any vulgarity or obscenity? Is it appropriate for high school students?		
2.	Does the piece have well detailed stage directions that include every entrance and exit and all major physical actions?		
3.	Does the piece include expository information that clearly and concisely establishes the setting and location of the piece?		
4.	Does the piece include expository information that establishes important given circumstances for each of the main characters?		
5.	Does the writer clearly establish unique "voices" for each of their characters?		
6.	Does the writer successfully sustain each character's "voice" throughout the piece?		
7.	Does the piece include at least one significant character discovery (turn around) – or Reversal of Fortune?		
8.	Do the characters seem to have conflicting Objectives that provide the play with momentum and drive?
